Postgraduate Teacher Apprenticeship


Train on the job while earning a salary

The Postgraduate Teacher Apprenticeship is a salaried route to Qualified Teacher Status. Open to applications with a start date this September 2025.

- Employer apprenticeship, levy funded
- 10-months (September June)
- Available for primary, special or secondary schools teaching
- Free of charge for apprentices provides a salaried route to teaching.

This new, salaried route to Qualified Teacher Status provides an employer levy-funded, salaried route into primary or secondary school teaching, and is free of

charge for apprentices, allowing graduates to earn while they learn on the job.



Candidates can apply to train for a range of secondary subjects, or follow a general primary, 3-7 or special educational needs (SEND) pathway for our primary programme.

In order to be accepted onto the programme, candidates will need to be employed in a school committed to putting them through an Apprenticeship on the unqualified teacher pay scale and meet the usual ITT entry requirements, as well as having been resident in the UK for at least three years.
