The ECF with UCL and TSH Berkshire



TSH Berkshire works with **UCL (Institute of Education)** to deliver the ECF. *Why?*

- UCL programme offers flexibility in delivery
- Year 2 includes an opportunity for ECTs to carry out short inquiry projects - valuable development opportunity, not 'more of the same'
- UCL (IoE) has established reputation for educational research
- Strong track record of designing and delivering evidence-informed, high quality CPD programmes.
- ECF leaders have a background in teaching and school leadership
- Commitment to working in partnership with hubs and their schools





Year 1

- Self study 4 hours per half term (2 hours in HT 6)
- Face to face training 2 hours per half term
- Online training 1 hour per half term
- Mentor meeting weekly 1 hour meeting
- ECTs should have a 10% timetable reduction.

Year 2

- Self study 1 hours per half term in half terms 1-5
- Face to face training 2 hours per half term in Autumn and Spring terms
- Mentor meeting fortnightly 1 hour meeting
- 2 School visits in second half of summer term
- Focus of the year is practitioner inquiry but some ECTs may decide with their mentor that it would be more beneficial to spend time re-visiting the material from Year 1 of the programme.
- ECTs should have a 5% timetable reduction.

Each year of the programme starts with an online induction conference


UCL ECF Programme Mentors




- Induction conference at the start of each year of the programme (this may be online or f2f TBC for 2024-25)
- Self study 2 hours per half term
- Online training 1 hour per term
- Mentor meeting weekly 1 hour meeting in year 1, fortnightly in year 2.
- There is no specified time allowance for mentors but they need sufficient time to carry out the role effectively.

Funding Year 1



- Schools receive their core funding through the <u>dedicated schools grant (DSG)</u>.
 This is calculated this using the <u>national funding formula (NFF)</u>. This funding is primarily based on pupil numbers and characteristics and is allocated by the local authority.
- Funding is not 'earmarked' for statutory induction. It's up to headteachers to manage the funding they receive.
- Headteachers should use core funding to cover the cost of 10% off timetable for ECTs in year 1 of induction.

Funding Year 2



- The DfE pay this funding directly to schools in the summer of year 2. It covers the cost of giving each ECT:
 - 5% off timetable in year 2 of induction
 - 20 hours of mentor support in year 2 of induction
- The DfE calculate funding using the average hourly rate for mentors and early career teachers, split by region.

Funding – Mentor Training



- For those using a funded provider, there will be an additional payment to schools for the time that mentors of ECTs spend on Department-funded mentor training, which will consist of 36 hours of backfill time over two years per mentor.
- There is more detail about these payments on the DfE website <u>here.</u>
- Eligible institutions will receive 2 payments to enable mentors to have time-off timetable to complete the 36 hours ECF-based mentor training. This will be paid over 2 payments in arrears.
- The first payment will be in the summer of year 1. This payment will be based on evidence lead providers share with DfE that the mentor has commenced training. It will fund 18 hours of mentor time off timetable for training.
- The second payment for the remaining 18 hours of mentor time off-timetable (36 hours in total) for mentor training will be made in the summer of year 2. This payment will be based on evidence that lead providers share with DfE that there has been sustained engagement with the mentor training.
- DfE makes backfill payments directly to institutions or to local authorities to pay maintained schools.
