Opportunities

The Mobius Maths Hub provides DfE fully-funded professional development, that means it is **free** to attend!

We host a range of activities, either face-to-face or online, to suit the needs of educators, schools and colleges. In most cases you will be working together with colleagues from schools in your area.



Work Group	A Work Group is a small team of educators who meet through the year to learn together, try new approaches in their classrooms and share these across their school or department. Led by an expert in maths education, the group supports both whole-school development and each teacher's professional growth.
Open work Group Programmes	A programme is professional development for individual educators. Participants join a wider cohort to build specialist knowledge (SKTM) or develop leadership skills.
Community	A community is a long-term group where teachers learn together, grow together, support each other and deepen their maths expertise with guidance from a Community Lead.
Targeted Support in Maths	Bespoke, expert-led support helping schools achieve lasting improvement in maths. School leaders work closely with a local Maths Hub expert to plan, implement and evaluate effective maths development over time.



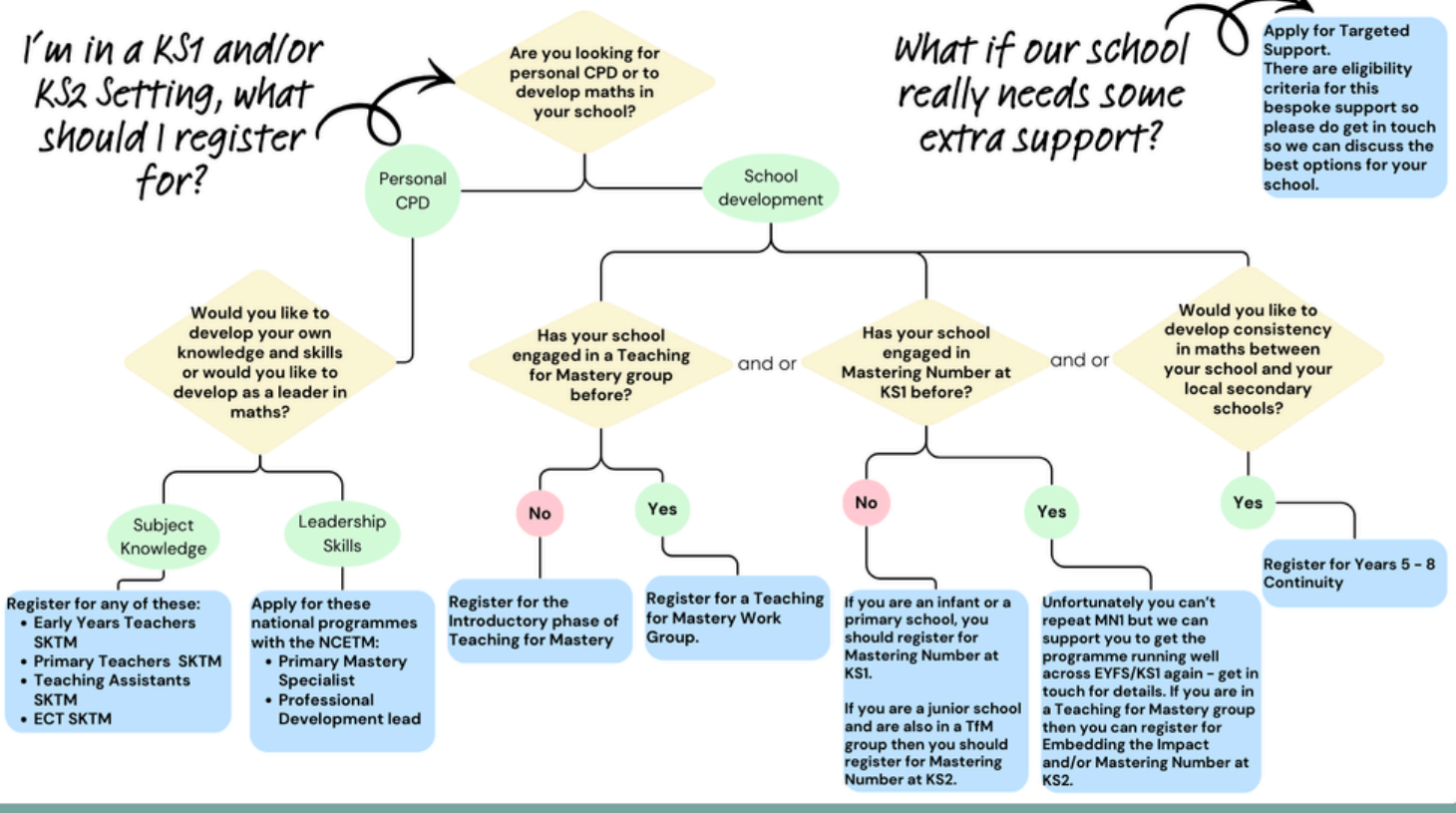

Teaching for Mastery

Teaching for Mastery focuses on the development of the school as a whole.

- It rejects the idea that a large proportion of people 'just can't do maths'.
- All pupils are encouraged by the belief that they can succeed.
- Pupils are taught through whole-class teaching, focusing on the same lesson content together. This supports all pupils to understand key concepts before moving on, ensuring no one is left behind.
- Procedural fluency and conceptual understanding are developed together, as each strengthens the other.

Mastering Number

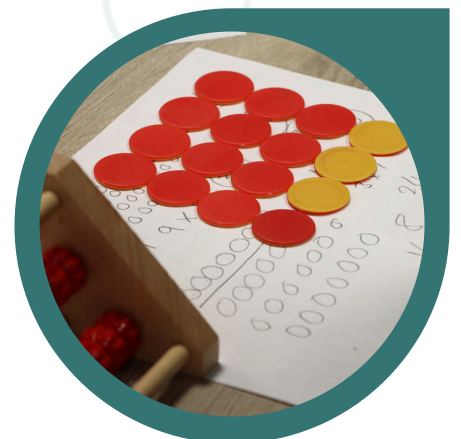
Mastering Number focuses on the development of the school as a whole.

It is a fully-funded national programme for KS1 and KS2 to build stronger number sense, maths fluency and confidence by focusing on core concepts like subitizing, number composition and relationships between numbers. Resources, training and manipulatives are provided.

- You will develop a secure understanding of how to build firm mathematical foundations.
- You will work with colleagues either in your school or in a local school to better understand how the Mastering Number resources can enhance teaching.

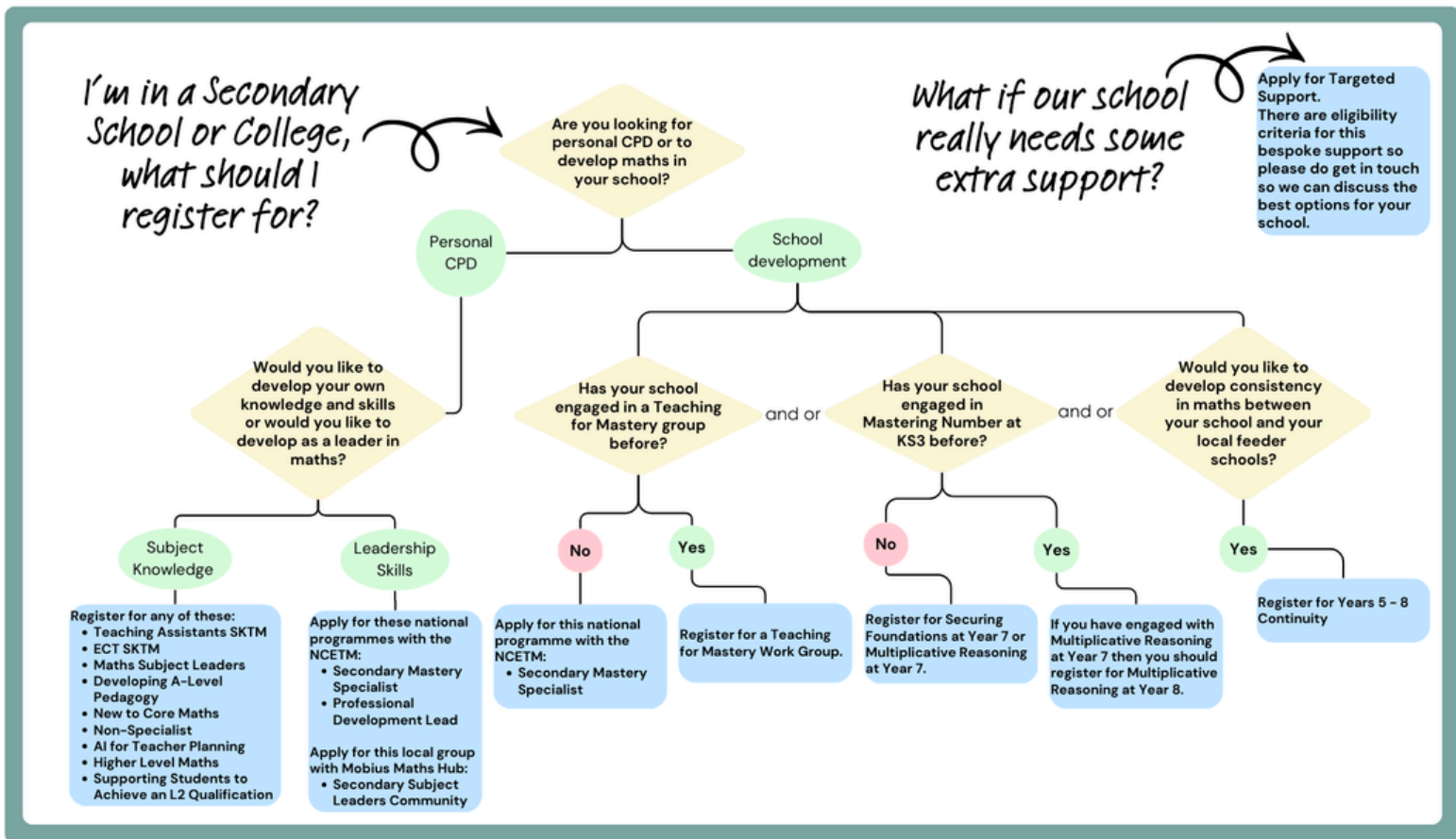

Intensive Support
