About the programme

Reception teaching is a critical point in early education and can affect the long-term outcomes of children, particularly from disadvantaged backgrounds. This programme will support teachers to deliver high-quality reception teaching by providing the knowledge, tools and confidence to apply innovative learning approaches.

Who is this programme for?

This programme is suitable for teachers who want to develop their reception-specific classroom pedagogy including:

- current reception teachers
- teachers moving into a reception role
- teachers who have completed their induction

Please note: this course is not suitable for teaching assistants.

What you will learn on this programme

You will learn practical strategies to improve children's outcomes, including how to:

- **Child Development.** Apply evidence-informed reception specific pedagogical

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knowledge to the classroom and establish effective communication and language development strategies.

- **Classroom Practice.** Plan appropriate curriculum and assessments and improve physical activity to develop children's well-being and motor-skills.
- **Inclusion and SEND.** Build expertise in identifying and adapting barriers to learning, ensuring every child receives the best start.
- **Transitions and Partnerships.** Build positive and collaborative relationships with parents/carers, other school professionals and external agencies and support smooth transitions for children in and out of reception.

UCL is committed to providing additional resources for those leading within a school (e.g. early years leaders/headteachers) to maximise teachers' engagement and the impact of the programme.

How is the programme delivered?

Designed to fit around your teaching commitments, the programme will:

- be delivered locally by regional Delivery Partners and support professional dialogue within and between schools,
- blend self-directed on-line study, face-to-face sessions, webinars and reflection activities,
- be inquiry-focused to support applying knowledge into practice over time and beyond the programme,
- take two school terms to complete (minimum 20 hours).

What funding is available?

Fully funded places are available for teachers working in most state-funded settings, including academies.

Examples of settings where funding is not available include:

- schools outside England
- independent schools

If you are not eligible for funding, you have the option to self-fund. If you choose this option, you still need to register with DfE. Once registered with DfE, they will inform you if you are eligible for funding.
