Initial Teacher Training

You will probably be aware that following the government's Market Review of ITT, there are significant changes planned for initial teacher training which will come into place for those starting programmes in September 2024. As a result of the review, any provider wishing to deliver ITT from this date needs to apply for accreditation. We took the decision as a hub not to apply to be an accredited provider in our own right, but to continue to work as a partner with current established university and SCITT providers in our hub region, in line with our vision of collaboration not competition.

Recommendations in the report include the following:

- · Providers of ITT should develop an evidence-based training curriculum as a condition of accreditation which allows trainees to understand and apply the principles of the Core Content Framework
- · Providers should design and deliver an intensive placement experience of at least 4 weeks (20 days) for single-year courses and 6 weeks (30 days) for undergraduate, over the duration of their course that allows opportunities for groups of trainees to practise selected, sequenced components of their training curriculum, and receive highly targeted feedback.
- · In addition to time spent in intensive training and practice, single year postgraduate courses must be designed to include at least 120 days (24 weeks) of school placements. During this time, trainees should be in the classroom for an average of at least 15 hours each week.
- · There is an increased focus on mentors and mentor development and the introduction of a "lead mentor" or "mentor leadership team". Lead mentors or the members of a mentor leadership team need to undertake 30 hours of training. General mentors (e.g subject mentors or class teacher mentors) should have 20 hours of training.
- · There should be annual refresher training for general mentors (6 hours) and lead mentors (12 hours)
- · Trainees should receive 1.5 hours of mentor support per week during placements.
- · Prospective accredited providers of ITT should go through a new, rigorous accreditation process to ensure that they are able to fully deliver the Quality Requirements.

Monthly Initial Teacher Training events at the University of Reading

The University of Reading host monthly online webinars to help prospective teachers understand the different routes into teaching. Free online course on teaching about climate and sustainability outdoors!

On 28th February, the University of Reading is launching: Teaching Climate and Sustainability in Primary Schools: An Outdoor Learning Approach a free online course hosted on the social learning platform, FutureLearn. The course is for Primary teachers who are concerned about our planet and want to take action by embedding these vital topics into their teaching using the outside as an extension of the classroom. Drawing on expertise and real examples, the course will guide teachers to discover and discuss what knowledge and skills are required for teaching climate and sustainability outdoors and apply this understanding to their own working practice.

The course takes approximately 6 hours of flexible study and is free to join on FutureLearn via this link.

We have continued with the delivery of the ECF, and while it is not without its challenges, we have been encouraged by participants' engagement in sessions and by the skills of our facilitators in adapting the materials to suit the context of their clusters.

In addition to the ECF training programme, this term we are offering some additional sessions, free of charge. Matt McArthur, from Whole School Send, ran a session in January on "Adapting Teaching for Children with SEND" which was attended by 43 ECTs and ITT trainees. Matt will be running a follow up session on 9th March 10.00-12.30 (online) which will be an opportunity for ECTs (and ITT trainees) to reflect on their practice and consider their strengths and areas for development in relation to SEND. The first cohort of the new NPQs launched in November and the February cohort is about to get underway. **There are 225 colleagues undertaking a programme with us** and as there are several other providers also offering these courses in our hub area, this means that a large number of staff are taking advantage of this opportunity, which is extremely encouraging for leadership development in Berkshire schools.

The courses remain fully funded for teachers in state schools and colleges and the next cohort will start in the Autumn term. Providers are currently going through a re-tendering process so the DfE registration website will be closed until approximately May.

New NPQs in Leading Literacy and Early Years Leadership:

In the Autumn Term and there will be two new NPQs added to the suite. We are currently waiting to see which lead providers will be awarded the contracts for these programmes, but we will be offering both programmes across the hub area, working with Whiteknights English Hub to deliver the NPQLL and Foundations for Learning Nursery School Federation on the Early Years Programme.

NPQ Leading Literacy

is aimed at teachers who have, or are aspiring to have, responsibilities for leading literacy across a school, year group, key stage or phase. It will be open to both primary and secondary colleagues. Although we are yet to see any specifics about the content, it will be based of the framework document which you can access here.

NPQ in Early Years Leadership

is for leaders qualified to at least Level 3 with a full and relevant qualification who are, or are aspiring to be, managers of Private, Voluntary and Independent nurseries, headteachers of school-based or maintained nurseries, or childminders with leadership responsibilities. Behaviour Hub

"Our work is moving into phase 3 which involves working on two MAT and three school projects. As ever it is a privilege to work alongside colleagues in very different schools and see the variety of different approaches to culture and behaviour development. What are emerging are a number of common themes eg: the desire to develop a common vision and language, alongside aligned record-keeping, across MATs and ways to build a shared understanding of what excellent behaviour and culture looks like so that roles and responsibilities are understood. There are also many discussions about supporting children and young people who have found returning to the routines and expectations of school challenging, after the disruption of the pandemic, and also supporting colleagues new to the profession who have not had the experience in classrooms that previous intakes would have had.

All of this makes the work very interesting, even more so now that relationships are starting to build and green shoots of impact starting to come through."

School to School Support

Oxfordshire and Reading SLP are offering secondary schools an opportunity for some school-to-school support, bespoke coaching, and consultancy from their trained and experienced facilitators, similar to the service previously offered by SLEs through Teaching School Alliances. This would be by arrangement and could include a science subject review, curriculum map analysis or bespoke coaching or mentoring - or a combination of these. We are trialling this at a reduced rate before the end of March to determine the level of need for this sort of support -there is a bursary to cover 75% of the costs, meaning that this would end up costing only £87.50 for a day of support (£350 cost with £262.50 repaid to school after the event) for the first 4 schools to sign up to this - it will be possible to arrange a date to suit you which can be after the end of March.
